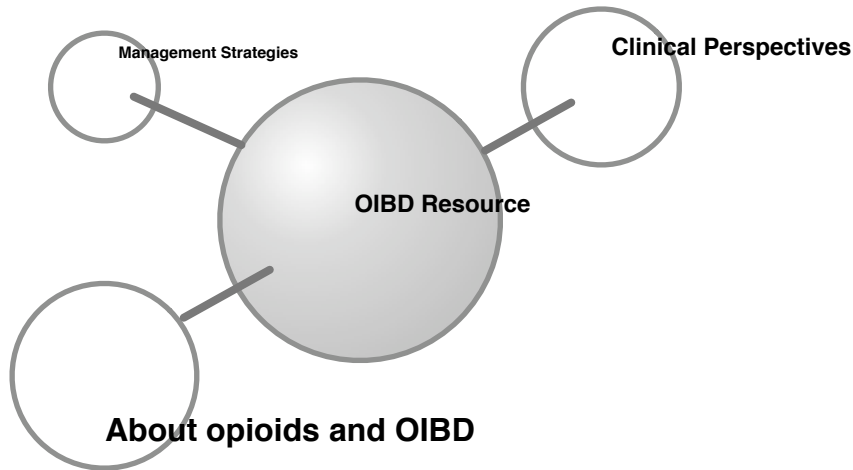


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Functional Brief version 1.0 11.01.06

The following schematics are not meant to convey visual design concepts. They are instead meant to convey, the functionality and navigation which will exist on any given page of the application. Final placement of elements along with page copy and nomenclature will be determined upon final definition and design phases of the program. This wireframe assumes a width of 990 pixels and a height of 620 pixels of better. Final height of a given page will be determined by content. Scrolling may need to be used in order for page content to be viewed.

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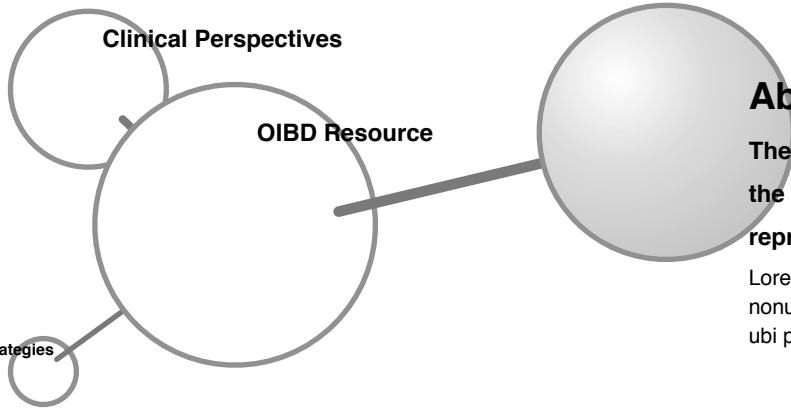

The management of constipation—the most common symptom of OIBD—represents a unique clinical challenge.

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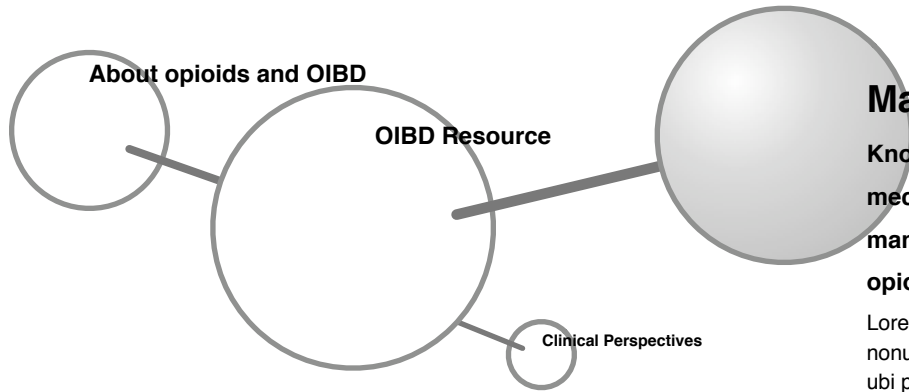

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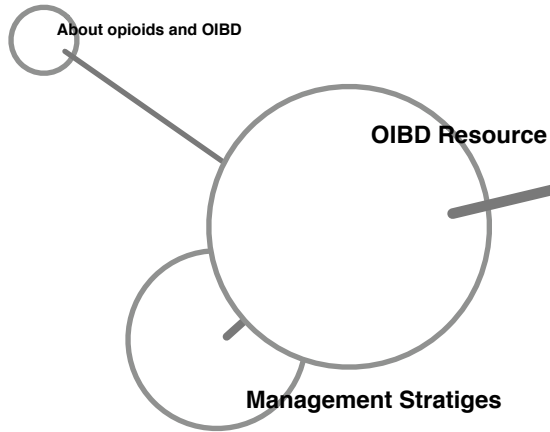
